The cost is \$20 per address.

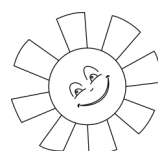

2024 MUNICIPAL ELECTION

This year is a municipal election year. Nominations will open in Fall 2024 for all positions of Council, which for the Town of Saltcoats includes 6 Councillor positions and 1 Mayor. Council members are entrusted to make decisions that directly affect the daily lives of residents, families, local business owners and others in the community. We need citizens to take on leadership roles as council members to represent their community and provide direction on policies, programs and services.

Key standards and values of a council member include:

- Honesty - Respect - Accountability - Responsibility
- Objectivity - Transparency - Confidentiality - Leadership in the Public Interest
