Fire Pit Permits

According to Bylaw No. 09-2018, "The Fire Pit Bylaw", no person shall set, cause or allow to be set, an open-air fire within the Town of Saltcoats without first having obtained a permit from the Town Office.

Permits are issued on an annual basis and will be in effect from January 1 to December 31 of each year.

The cost of the annual permit is \$20.00 per address.

The regulations governing the use of open air fire pits are in place to ensure the safety of residents, prevent fires and minimize the nuisance to neighbours.

Paying in Cash at the Town Office

Effective June 1, 2022, the Town Office will only accept a maximum of \$300 cash when making a payment or purchase due to the closure of the Saltcoats Cornerstone Credit Union.

Saltcoats Beautification Committee Historic Silhouette **Banner Donations**

Harry and Evelyn Kardynal and relatives have donated funds for a Ukrainian silhouette banner. It features a Ukrainian dancer and sunflowers (the national flower). It will soon be installed, as will other additional banners.

The Yorkton SaskTel Pioneers Club has recently donated to this project also. The banner will feature a silhouette of a telephone lineman up a telephone pole near the old telephone office (where The Prairie Cricket Antiques is presently located).

Gerri and Ron Knudsen donated for a Patagonia Welsh banner. It will feature a Welsh woman in heritage Welsh dress. Gerri's grandmother (Val Trowell's mom) was just 2 years old when her Welsh family immigrated from Patagonia, Argentina. A Welsh colony had gone to Argentina 35 years before but due to government changes, they decided to move to Canada in 1902.

The Legacy Co-op has also donated \$600.00 for a Historic Silhouette. Co-operatives have been a big part of Saltcoats history. In the Roots and Branches history book, a Co-op Creamery was running in Saltcoats in 1891. There was also a Bee Keepers Co-op in the early years. Later there was a Co-op grocery store, a Co-op bulk fuel business, cooperative snow plow clubs, etc. If anyone has any old photos of the Saltcoats Co-op creamery or store we would love to see them as the design of this banner is still being worked on.
