



Saltcoats Beautification Committee News—Summer 2021

Historic Plaque— A historical plaque of “The Cottage Hospital” (which includes a photo made from an original glass plate) will soon be added to the Legion Park/ Arboretum. It will be located in the NE corner of the park close to where the hospital was located. Thank you to D’s Sign and Designs of Yorkton and local welder Wayne Gibson for their special “Friends of Saltcoats” rates.

Historic Metal Silhouettes—The cloth banners on the streetlight posts on Commercial Street have been a popular part of the Beautification of the downtown area for more than 20 years. The banner designs have included: Provincial Floral Emblems, birds, Christmas designs, and lines from the poem “in Flanders Field”. As cloth banners fade, rip, etc., the Beautification Committee made a decision to try something more permanent and opted for steel silhouettes with designs that would celebrate the long and rich history of Saltcoats. The first design is of North West Mounted Police and includes the dates when there was a depot in Saltcoats. The silhouette will feature Saltcoats train station and approaching train. (We are still searching for a good photo showing the front of the station, so we are asking you to check your albums please). Other possible designs include: grain elevators, a buffalo, pioneer with ox and cart, church, school house, a boating on the lake scene, Scottish piper, celebrations of ethnic groups who settle here (Hungarian, Ukrainian, Welsh, etc.). We are open to more ideas and suggestions. The cost of each banner is \$500.00, which includes the painting and powder coating (so they won’t rust). Donations for this project are most welcome and needed. Donor names and/or the names of the person (s) or group (s) the donation is to honour will be acknowledged.

Wood Chip Mulch— One of the ways you can assist the work of the Beautification Committee is by making a donation. All donations are receipted and as a donation to a Canadian Municipality can be used for income tax purposes. Many of our trees and scrubs have benefitted from wood chip mulch being generously supplied. Mulching makes area mowing and weed control much more manageable. Mulching stabilizes moisture availability for tree roots. It also prevents premature warming of the soil in the Spring (a major cause of Winter-kill and sun scalding). It also delays freeze up in the Fall, extending the season for trees to harden off for better wintering results. A general donation or a specified donation for a particular use (such as the purchase and transport of mulch) are all welcomed. Donation can be made through the Saltcoats Town Office. Thank you.
