Dear friends, neighbours, and community members,

The Saltcoats District Regional Park is continuing to see improvements to its facilities and grounds.

There has been a great deal of work and fundraising done to get a new floating swim dock, aeration system, and upgrade the washrooms.

All donations and work in kind for these improvements have been gratefully appreciated. The generosity of this community is astounding.

The Park Board has a new undertaking to build up the road and the parking area.

A drainage culvert has already been installed and work is about to commence to put soil fabric, A-base and gravel down so that the park is cleaner and no more muddy areas even after a good rain.

We are asking residents of the area to consider making a small donation to the park to help pay for this undertaking. Our goal is to raise \$3000 to cover the costs. Every dollar helps. Donations would be considered charitable and donors would get receipts for income tax purposes.

Donors will be recognized on a digital board displayed on the Town of Saltcoats webpage (if the donor wishes). Donors names will be entered into a draw for a beautiful surprise gift basket. Draw will be made at the park as part of the July 1st celebrations.

Property Tax Notices

2024 property tax notices were mailed out on May 6th, 2024.
Due Date: June 30th, 2024

- A charge of 1.5% will be applied on the first day of each month on any taxes remaining unpaid after June 30th.
- If you did not receive your tax notice or have just purchased a property and did not receive the tax notice from the previous owner, contact the Town Office.
- Failure to receive a tax notice does not relieve the ratepayer from payment of taxes nor from liability of penalty/interest for late payment.

Friendly Reminder About Garbage, Recycling and Metal Bins

In April, the Town received a \$719.10 contamination fine for the metal bin on High St. There was an item(s) placed in the bin that was not metal which resulted in this fine. The Town would like to remind residents of what can be placed in the bins around town.

METAL BIN

The metal bin on High Street is on site to receive metal only. No metal combined with wood, plastic, Styrofoam, etc. **Do not leave any items on the ground anywhere on site.**

BIG ITEM BINS

The big item bins on High Street are on site for oversized household garbage except: household trash, fridges, freezers, microwaves, TV's, animal carcasses, and excessive amounts of construction material. All of these items are the responsibility of the user to dispose of. At present the Town has no economic way to dispose of these items. **Do not leave any items on the ground anywhere on site.**

RECYCLE ROLL OFF BIN

The recycle bin on Allan Ave is for commercial use only. It is meant to receive cardboard broken down and produced by companies doing business in town. **Styrofoam is not a recyclable product at the present time and should be placed in your waste cart.**

SUMMARY

The big bins on High Street and Allan Ave are placed as a convenience for town residents. Continued abuse of this convenience will result in their removal.
