### SALTCOATS UNITED CHURCH NEEDS A NEW ROOF! The "RAISE THE ROOF" campaign begins!

For many years this building has hosted a large open-to-all Sunday School and various youth groups. Here baptisms and marriages were celebrated, and lives were celebrated as we marked the deaths of family members and neighbours. Many workshops and special speakers were hosted, many musical events took place, and all were welcomed. Folks passing through found a place to rest or even sleep the night. Some who never attended a service found comfort in passing by the beloved landmark and the beacon of hope and caring. Today our church needs new shingles. Careful investigation shows many are broken, nearly bare, or already taken off by the wind. The shingles are too old to have enough insurance value to meet the deductible, so that means the job must be financed from scratch. We have accepted a quote from a roofer who loves churches and the challenges of corners, seams and troughs. The project will cost \$28,873. For \$9.00 per square foot, we will re-shingle the 3560 square feet. Please consider helping by making a tax-deductible donation. 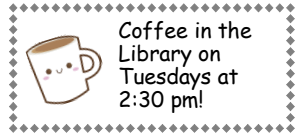
